Discover Medieval Boots

Medieval boots come in many different forms. Throughout the years people of the middle ages realized the need for different types of boots for different occasions. They also found that people liked boot variety back then like they like shoe variety now. I wrote this page to talk about the various types of medieval foot wears. I'll even tell you a great place to go to purchase some fantastic looking replica boots.

Firstly, I should tell you the names of some of the more popular medieval boots. These include: cavalier boots, altair boots, castle top leather boots, high boots with fringes, King Henry boots, Locksley boots, low boots with fringe, low boots without fringe, leather calf boots, musketeer boots, phantom boots, viking boots, captains boots, dragoon boots, high seas boots, swashbuckler boots, D'artagnon boots, and even villager boots. In order to keep this article short, we will only cover a few of these.

The first type of boots we will discuss are cavalier boots. These boots extended all the way up to the knees and had large fold over cuffs at the top. These cuffs were folded to the outside or the inside depending on who was wearing them.

Following this we have the Altair [medieval boots](#). Providing protection to the wearers shins, the Altair boot went all the way up to the bottom of the knees. This boot had 2 distinct parts and could be changed depending on your needs.

Castle top leather boots are the next type of boots we will discuss. Crenellation edges at the top of these boots give them their name and distinct look. They extend all the way up the shin and do not stop until just before the knee. You can see these boots in the Showtime series "The Tudors".

Fringed high boots were very popular medieval style boots. The moccasin style design is made up of a suede material. Extending up to the knees, the boots tops fold over on the outside of the boot. Its laces go all the way from the bottom to the top of the boot.

Measuring at a height of twenty five inches, the King Henry boots are some of the tallest medieval boots around. Materials used in replica King Henry boots are leather and suede.
