The sharpness of the blades is the defining feature of each type of [medieval sword](#). Reenactment swords are always much more blunt than a cutting sword or even a display weapon. This is because these swords will be used in simulated combat and a sharp sword could cause accidental injury. Reenactment guilds tend to have rules and regulations that specifically lay out the level of bluntness that a weapon must have in order to be used in a reenactment.

Cutting and sparring swords require a sharp blade. They need to be fully functional swords. Martial artists and folks looking to buy a useable tool or weapon would probably want to purchase these types of medieval swords.

The display sword is a bluntly designed sword, but not quite as blunt as a reenactment sword. You won't accidentally cut yourself while placing these types of swords into their displays. These swords are not created in any special way to make them more blunt than they need to be. As a result, this sword comes at a better price tag than either the sparring sword or the reenactment sword.
